JIM'S SPRUES & REVIEWS JAMES GULD

This month, I thought I would review the new Dragon Panzer IVE. There are a number of reviews of this kit online at Missing-Lynx, Armorama, Track Link, and Perth Military Modeling Site. At the Missing-Lynx site, a number of Japanese modelers mentioned some of the kit flaws. Most are minor and some of them I can't verify, as the drawings that the modelers are using are different then the drawings that I have of the Panzer IVE.

The biggest problem I've noticed so far is that the front final drive is too low. It's not much, about .040". I doubt I'll be moving mine. I have also heard that Dragon will fix this so if you wait a few months then pick up a kit it should be fixed by then.

Some of the other problems pointed out by the



Japanese modelers are as follows: The hull tub is too long, the size of the drivers front view port is too big, the turret machine gun is slightly too low, the key cover triangle for the radio operators hatch is facing the wrong direction (I tried to compare the hull length and from the drawings I have in Panzer Tracts #4, it seems to be okay).

Like I said, they're all minor problems except for maybe the drive sprocket, and even that may not be noticeable once built.

Now, no kit is perfect, but I'll have to say that this kit is pretty darn good in my book. I'll just have out the usual reference books to double-check items. I don't plan on using any aftermarket parts at all.

It comes with nice tracks, which have the hollowed-out guide tooth and only a small amount of ejector pin marks to clean off the inner face.

It also comes with optional photo-etched parts for the tool clamps and two complete sets of on-board tools. One set has the clamps already molded on and the other set is hare

They also give you two sets of side fenders, one with the tool position holes and one without. These fenders also have underside details.

They also provide an aluminum barrel, but the kit's plastic barrel comes with rifling, which the aluminum one is missing.

The kit comes with interior details for the turret, like a complete turret basket and gun details along with all the interior hatch details.

They also give you more PE parts like the spare bogie holders, and they are pre-bent.

They also give you chains for the smoke discharge rack and front spare track holders.

The moldings all look to be very crisp and I didn't see any flash anywhere.

Dragon seems to be just getting better and better. They are now even starting to offer limited run kits only available online through DragonUSA. Now I just want them to focus on more allied stuff like a new M2 or M3 half-track

series. "Oh, happy days, to get back into model making!" is all I can say, and the shelves are quickly being filled up at my house. Now I'll have to take my own advice and go build something.
