### JIM'S SPRUES & REVIEWS JAMES GULD

Okay, you treadheads, save up those pennies because there are some new releases on the way, just in time for Christmas.

I'll start out with resin. Hussar has some new wheel sets for the Opel Blitz, AB-41 Sahariana, Schwimmwagen, and some for T-34s.

Tasca plans to release their early M3 style suspension as a separate kit along with kits for an early .50-cal, and limited edition releases of .30 cal mg's and a US marked M4A1 DV Sherman.

Resicast has a 1914 Rolls-Royce armored car coming out this month.

Ultracast has a couple of new British/Commonwealth tank figures coming out.

Plus Model has some new diorama accessories like a European style WWII intact house, field-washing station, US weapon set from the Vietnam era, and an M422 Command Car.

LionMarc has retooled their .50-cal barrel and also have a 2cm barrel for German armored vehicles.

Zvezda announced a 4.5-ton Mercedes supply truck for early 2009.

Schatton Modellbau has a new Mercedes 4500 truck with AA rocket mount.

Bronco Models has a new German 221 armored car set for a December release and individual tracks for the A13 Cruiser tank.

Dragon/CyberHobby has their own version of the M4A1 DV out now along with the M3 style suspension set with DS Vinyl tracks for the early Sherman. They also plan to release German onboard tools and some of their "magic tracks" and Sherman tracks.

Tristar has a German 222 armored car set for a December release.

Hobby Fan has some more goodies for the upcoming Churchill III tank: one is a crew set for NW Europe, and the other is a stowage set.


MiniArt has some new figure sets coming out of German armored car crew and a British/Commonwealth armored car crew set. They also announced a new Dingo MkIb scout car set for January 2009.

I also see that Dragon have the new M3 GMC and T-34 Hex turret kits out now. I haven't seen them up close but did see sprues over on the Armorama web site.
